<b>Analyze</b> <b>Break information into parts based on purpose, structure, or relationships</b>	Example: Compare and contrast real world situations of ethnocentrism.	Small group discussion
Categorize, compare, classify, differentiate, discriminate, dissect, distinguish, divide, examine, explain, illustrate, infer, outline, question, simplify, test for		
<b>Apply</b> <b>Use information in new situations</b>	Example: Identify situations of ethnocentrism in the real world.	Think-pair-share
Build, calculate, choose, classify, compare, demonstrate, dramatize, experiment with, identify, interview, model, organize, plan, predict, solve, show, use		
<b>Understand</b> <b>Describe an idea, concept or fact</b>	Example: Give an example of ethnocentrism.	One-minute paper
Classify, compare, contrast, describe, discuss, draw, explain, infer, interpret, outline, paraphrase, predict, relate, rephrase, show, summarize, translate		
<b>Remember</b> <b>Recall information from memory</b>	Example: Define ethnocentrism.	One-minute paper
